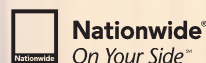

Built in 1896, the historic Southern Theatre is located at 21 East Main Street, just two blocks south of the Ohio Theatre. Originally built as an opera house, the Southern was designed for live performances, and offers exceptional acoustics and an extraordinarily intimate setting. Additionally, a top-to-bottom renovation in 1998 brought modern amenities and comforts to its historical beauty and natural architectural acoustics, making the Southern Theatre ideal for showcasing the live performance of opera.

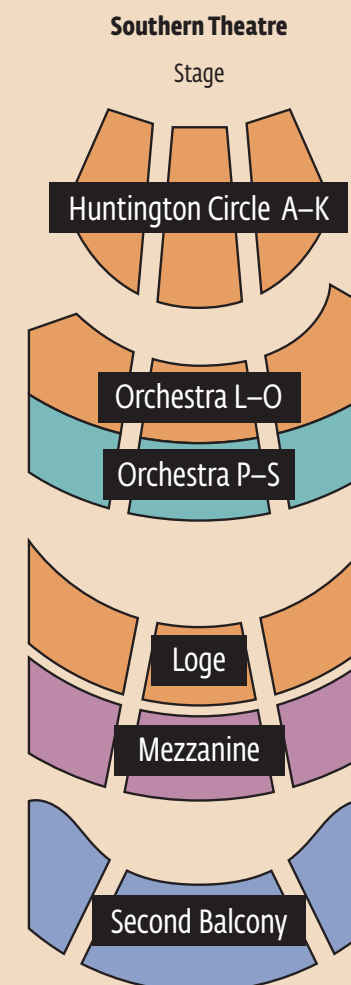
### Comfortable Accommodations

When the Southern Theatre was renovated, special care was taken to ensure patron comfort. Because of the theatre's jewel box architectural style, the furthestmost seat from the stage is only 75 feet away, offering a guaranteed intimate experience no matter where you sit! Please let us know if you have special seating needs, as the main floor offers plenty of accessible seating in the rear floor section.

### Convenient Parking

Parking is available directly across the street at the Columbus Commons parking garage with clearly marked entrances on East Rich Street and East Main Street. Signs inside the garage will guide you to the theatre entrance, and a Columbus police officer will stop traffic both before and after the performance so you can safely cross East Main Street.
